


What is Lowell Forward?

Together, we will define a shared vision and framework to guide and shape the next 20 years of our city.



Plan for Downtown growth	Enable diverse housing options in Downtown, updating zoning and dimensional requirements in Downtown to enable smaller and more diverse housing options	
	Improve welkability in Downtown by including wider sidewalks, more trees, active storefronts, shorter crossings, and longer crossing times



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


